Pupil Premium Policy

The pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers. Funding is received for children who have been registered as eligible for free school meals in the last 6 years. All schools are required to report on the amount of funding and how this is being used.

Principles

- We organise teaching and learning at Offham School in order to meet the needs of all children in the best way.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for children who belong to vulnerable groups and that socially disadvantaged children have their needs adequately assessed and met.
- We recognise that not all children who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged and we also recognise that not all children that are disadvantaged have free school meals.
- We will allocate Pupil Premium funding from considering the emotional, social and educational needs of that pupil.

Provision

Maths

- Supplementary groups to provide focused support during lessons.
- Intervention groups to focus on closing the gaps in maths.
- Resources to inspire and support pupils.

Reading and Writing Support

- “Beanstalk” Interventions to accelerate progress and enjoyment of reading.
- Daily reading with an adult to ensure that the children have access to a range of literature and can improve their reading skills.
- One to one specific literacy support to provide focused intervention.
- Intervention groups to support children with specific learning needs to support reading and writing.
- Use of innovative technology to inspire and engage children in their writing/reading.
- Resources to inspire and support pupils

Pupil Wellbeing

- Providing places at a breakfast club in order to ensure the best possible start to the school day.
- Homework Club for targeted children.
- Payment for clubs or school trips
- Groups for specific needs, such a sensory and social
